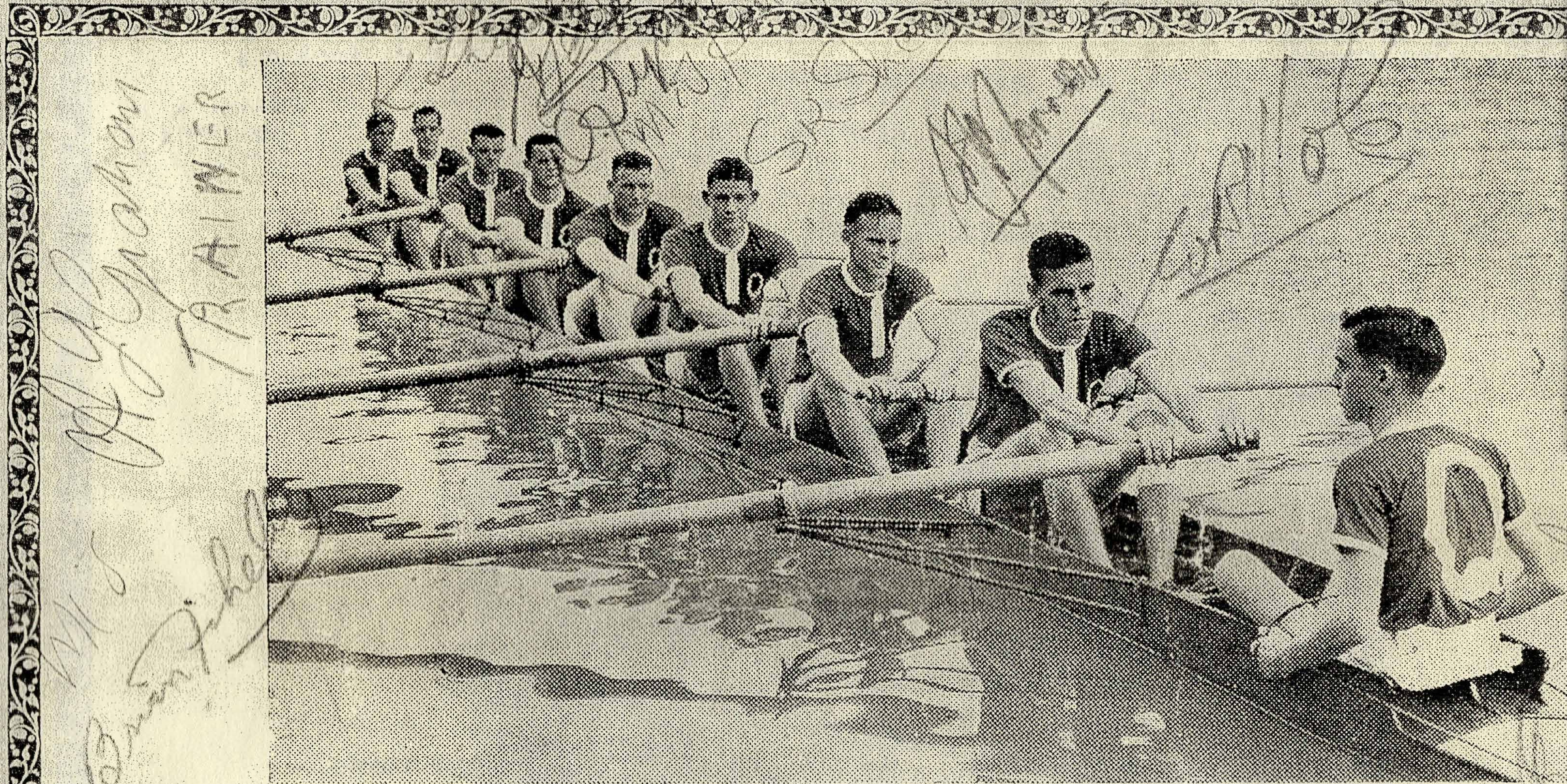
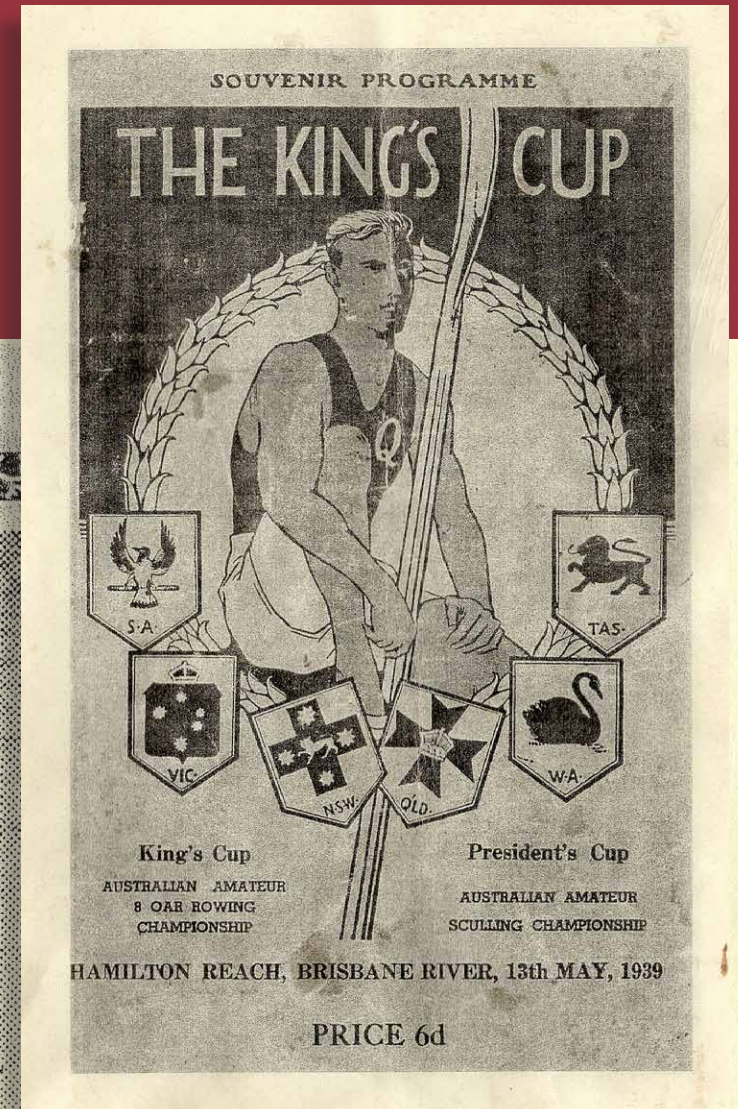

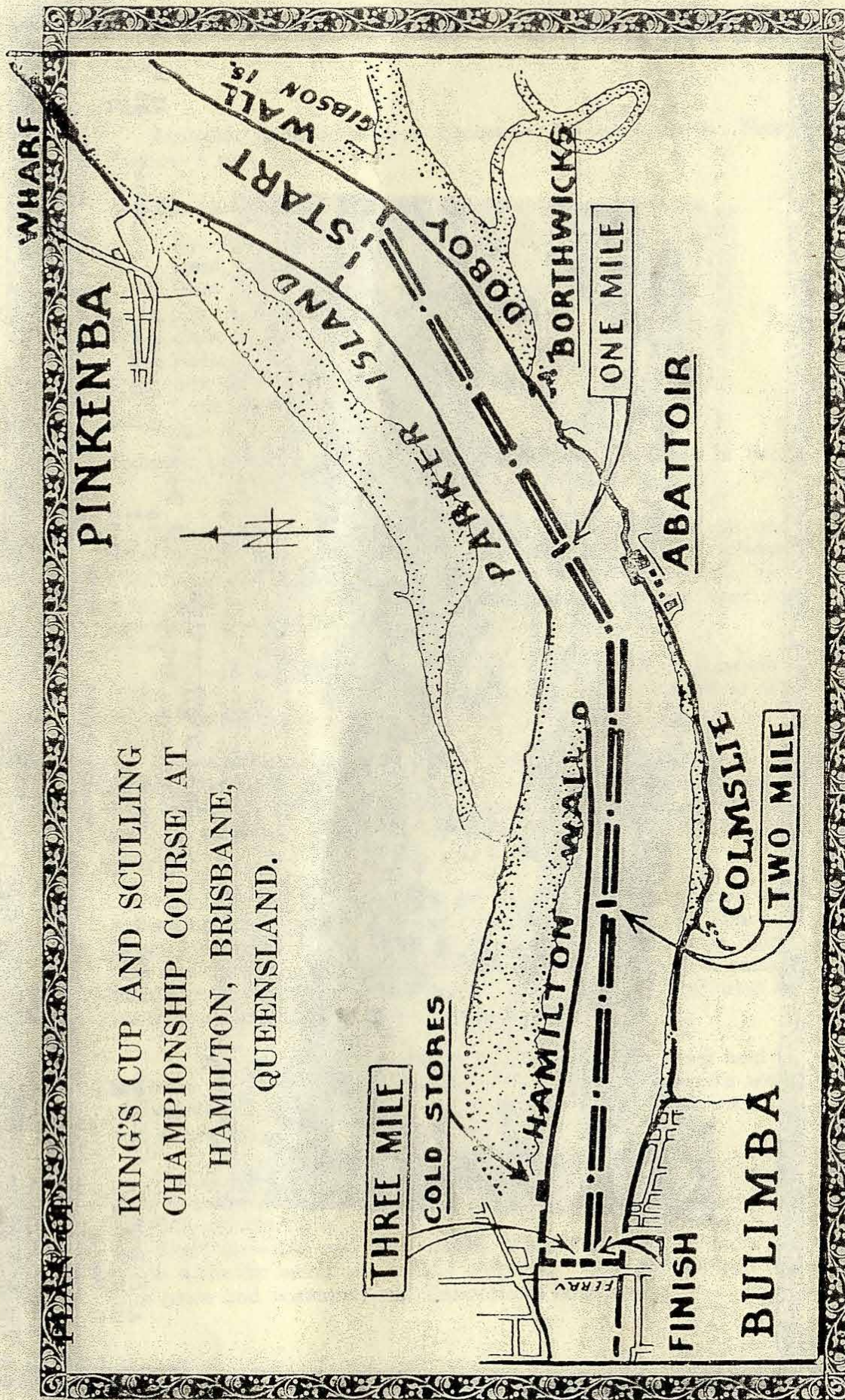

COURSE: Starting on an imaginary line from two marking pegs on the North Bank to a point on the South Bank 146 yards below the red beacon on the down stream side of the drain outlet at the City Electric Light Coy.'s Power House at Doboy, and finishing at a point 60 feet from the City End of Brett's Wharf.

STATIONS: At the start, No. 1 position will be nearest the North Bank.
